ACTION REQUIRED

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| 1. ROADS - No major improvement since last year. Metal dumped as corrugations occur and road breaks down very quickly. The base is not being prepared. Road base is gone. | No action required |
| 2. Gisborne Holdings Ltd (GHL) is a good model. 100% owned so Gisborne District Council (GDC) has a strong asset base. | No action required |
| 3. Concern about new pool and parking metres. | No action required |
| 4. Roading budget has decreased and we are seeing the results. | No action required |
| 5. Talk more with forestry sector about building roads – can do it for cheaper. | Refer to T.Roads |
| 6. Place a levy on hectare of forestry harvested and put back into roads. Activate Tairāwhiti (AT) says we will be working on a fair tool to levy. Setting up Working Group to work on funding proposal for next year. | No action required |
| 7. Nedine: Reviewing the NOC to allow partnering with forestry companies to access their expertise/joint procurement for metal. | No action required |
| 8. Rakauroa Road has declined rapidly in the last 12 months. Very slippery in wet conditions. Dave Hadfield met with landowners and quarry owner recently regarding installing passing bays – joint project with Council and quarry a possibility. | Refer to T.Roads |
| 9. Downer pushed up metal material on Rakauroa Road side which has caused flooding at metal area where it comes out onto the main road. Will be sorted by TRoads (no more flooding signs). | Refer to T.Roads |
| 10. Motu Road culvert on the blind corner has resulted in a big hole forming on the corner. Very hazardous and growing. Dave Hadfield to look at relocating culvert away from the corner, among other options including draining the water table. | Refer to T.Roads |
| 11. Does Motu get a township upgrade? Council staff will come back on this (2022/23). | Refer to Strategic Policy |
| 12. Floodbanks – Nedine noted that Council is looking at a new model for the project focussed on getting access to private land (80% owned now). | No action required |
| 13. When is the Motu River Plan going to happen – keeps getting pushed back? Nedine promised to come back to the community. | Refer to Environmental Monitoring |
| 14. The township upgrades are a great thing – very positive. | No action required |
| 15. Floor in Fire Station meeting room was flooded by an overflowing culvert. An RfS was submitted but not sure if the issue has been progressed. Neville is the contact in the community. | Refer to Customer Service for follow up |

16. Cameras at Motu toilets – need access to Community Caretakers cabinet – Peter Sullivan.

17. Tennis court on reserve – foot ends for the nets need repairing. Land is privately owned but was signed over to Council. Apparently Council staff was given evidence of the sign over but was not followed up. Andrew taking back comments to his team to respond.
