## ACTION REQUIRED

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1. Resident - Where's Meng, he didn't come last year either.  
Response – Not sure, he had another engagement, we can find out you want us to. No action required

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  2. **Finance**  
Resident - In 2023 there's a big spike in spending what's causing that... Forestry?  
Response – Forestry but mostly Wastewater No action required

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  3. **Reticulation**  
Resident – What part of that increase relates to Wainui , we don't have sewerage disposal. If Sponge Bay are getting reticulation when are we getting infrastructure for Wainui and Okitu? Is there no proposal for Wainui Reticulation for Sewerage? General discussion back and forth about both Water and Sewer reticulation.  
Response – Nothing in the next 10 years, there is a project in 7 years to look at Wainui Reticulation beyond that. Your community is still divided and emotive. You need to put in a submission to the LTP. The issue is not with Wainui it is the network in town that could not cope with adding Wainui and beyond. We do not currently have the capacity to take your waste back to the city and we would need another dam at Waingake to bring water to Wainui that would be \$30 million alone. We cannot fix this in the short term but please put in a submission to the LTP and then we can look at bringing the process forward. No action required  
  
Pat Seymour – speaking as a ratepayer not as a councillor. Suggested council should prepare some information and a timeline for the residents.  
Response – So you want us to prepare the figures and come back to the community.  
  
Resident – Most places around the country of similar size to Wainui & Okitu are reticulated. GDC is dragging the chain.  
Response – Nick Zaman, I have come from regions where this has happened. Gave examples of WBOP places where this work is being looked at. It was 15 to 20K per house hold. Looking at doubling your rates over a 5year period.

**4. Rates Rises**

Resident – You've given different level re rate rises, how do you come up with these scenarios?

Response - Big processes and Planning exercises, we know what infrastructure we need and then we look at levels of service. The councillors have to work out where we can spend the money.

**5. Sewerage Overflows in town**

Resident – I am a plumber and there are still overflows in the city occurring at addresses where it has happened for 40 years.

Response – Please can we get those addresses as we think we caught up with most but there may be some where the owners haven't come forward.

**6. Wainui Residents Assn. Donation**

Resident – We wound up the Wainui Residents Assn. and offered the money to GDC for 2 or 3 seats to go in at Okitu and Wainui. The proposal has been with council for 3 years, we want to spend the money so we can close accounts.

Response – We definitely want the money we will take you details and follow up for you.

**7. Weeds**

Resident – Bone seed plants in the Wainui Reserve not being monitored. Someone came and cut with a weed eater. Also Moth plant and agapanthas need control.

Response – We have a weed plan and Bone seed is one we are looking to control in this area. Can't give you an exact date as yet.

Resident – Argentinian pampas is growing on our roadsides, will soon be the national flower of Gisborne

Response – We are having stern words with our T-Roads. Particularly from Wainui to Tolaga, it is top of our priorities to stop this spreading up the coast.

More weed discussion followed.

**8. Wainui Beach Management Strategy**

Resident – Wainui Beach Management strategy took 2 years, what is happening about protecting breach front properties? Will Gabion Baskets be repaired if they fail? What are the residents going to be able to do if it all goes wrong? Council needs to come up with a strategy for these houses.

Response – Yes the consent has changed, we've got a paper going to council seeking direction. Then we will hold a community meeting about the options.
