| 1. Roading – Roding, forestry is the big issue of the day: what is the policy around the opportunity for long trucks to check loads. Council has made no attempt to ensure this happens, truck drivers do it outside the old hotel... hole got really deep 200 metres wide.... Trucks have gone over the footpaths and are wrecking the roadsides. We should move them along or have designated areas for them to pull off the side of the road, to check their loads. Discussion followed, we do not have a policy, and we can have a conversation with NZTA and the police/enforcement. Transit NZ need to provide opportunities for it to be done safely, loads regularly move and need to be readjusted regularly. Stop and tighten. Whatatutu is concerned about the footpath and the huge hole. | Refer to T.Roads |
| 2. Track by Puketara Station – Track by Puketara Station, there is a big hole there, can council fill it. It's private property, but GDC should go have a look, because there has been a lot of rubbish dumping there in that area. | RFS submitted 19/03 |
| 3. Animals – Dead sheep in the river, health hazards. GDC encourages people to call it in as an RFS so it can be removed. | No action required |
| 4. Animals – We have a problem with horses and dogs, when we ring up it feels like we are being annoying. We had a guy kill a horse and they came, took it away, but we are regularly at risk of running into a horse on the road. Discussion followed, Nick will review. Dangerous dogs in the community – people let them roam around at night. Response: We need people to call them in and report the issues as they happen so we can issue notices and enforce. Have the kids been given much education around dangerous dogs? We offer to go to the schools to share about it. Lisa mentioned that the SPCA do that kind of education with schools also. | Refer to Regulatory Services |
