RE: Wainui Beach Resource Consent Hearing

Further to the invitation from Neil Daykin at the pre-hearing meeting of 20 December 2017 I wish to amend my submission as follows:

1. We support the removal of sand push-ups as an emergency response from the application for resource consent.
2. As per the 2014 Wainui Beach Management Strategy, and the earlier 2003 version we support a designed response to episodic erosion that threatens properties.
3. It is our submission that the gabion baskets are maintained to prevent failure during erosion episodes.
4. We absolutely support the placement of rocks at the toe of the dune at 21 Wairere Road (Milton property). We do not want these removed.
5. We submit that the rocks have been placed at an angle complementary to the dunes/tide process and are now all but covered naturally in dune vegetation as is the area adjacent (south) and the "cut away" at the end of "Caldwell's wall" (19 Wairere Road).
6. Further, it is our submission that the Wainui Beach Strategy needs a partial review (within six months) to include an emergency response to erosion events that threaten dwellings, in consultation with the community.
7. My submission is that the response be similar in nature to the rocks that have been placed at the toe of the dune at the Milton property.

The GDC has removed sand scraping, which I think is a good idea as they will not be effective on wainui beach. When we asked Neil Daykin what the new backup plan is for beachfront dwellers in high erosion events. Daykin stated evacuation. I am not at all in agreement with this approach.

I came away from the meeting feeling very frustrated and disappointed with Daykin mind set, we all most work towards the same goal one that will help beachfront dwellers

We need a plan to adept in ways that will reduce the impact of natural disasters. As wainui residents we know that the gabion baskets are an effective measure against high erosion. We also have expert advice from Dr Paul Komar on geotextile sand bags

I would like to request

1. A partial review of the wainui Beach Management strategy within the next 6 months to include an emergency response to erosion events that threaten dwellings.
2. A proposed response for a cohesive whole of beach strategy for high erosion events that threaten dwellings that may be similar to the rocks at 21 Wairere Rd or geo-textile sand bags or a more recent alternative.
3. That the 21 Wairere Rd structure remains in place until the outcome of the partial review is completed.
