In opposing removal of rocks from Wainui Beach.
21 Wairere Road.

1. It is best to sight the before and after evidence of these rocks. They were placed in a time of emergency and they were very effective in preventing further and destructive erosion to the foreshore.
2. Maybe these rocks were not engineered correctly at the time due to the emergency, however they now exist, without resource consent. It is important to let them remain for another period of time by way of a constructive experiment to observe the logical and physical format of this work over and above engineering and scientific policy.
3. A public hazard. It has been stated that they are a public hazard. Rocks on a beach!?
4. Observing the beachfront protection from 21 Wairere Road right down to 1 Tuahine Crescent one observes many types of engineered physical protection continuously the length of the beach. Most of this engineering is at 90 degree to the ocean surface and is therefore very destructive to the flow of the seas energy.
5. What can be observed at 21 Wairere Road and indeed further beyond the rock revetment structure to the south is the use of limestone rocks. I refer to the works of Dr Viktor Schaubberger "The Water Wizard" Turbulence Phenomena of Flowing Water. It is stated the polarity between calcium (limestone) and silica (sand) is opposite and therefore attracting thus forming a mass. After a time floral grows in the situation. I would propose, as a positive advancement of what is at 21 Wairere road, a continuation of better engineering and in the effort of community spirit to erect and/or repair gabion baskets from this location south to the entry of the stock route No1 Wairere Road. To then place on top of the said baskets the preferred limestone rocks at 33 degree to the ocean surface, AND THEN apply a small sand push up on top of this structure. A community effort of revegetation can then be effectively put in place as can be witnessed at the far end of Wainui Beach to the south of the surf club. In terms of payment for such a construction it could be considered that consultation with the affected residents may take place to see if cost effective fund raising could be provided to supplement regional council budgets. This would encourage more of a user pays involvement.

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6. Caldwell's wall, and indeed the rocks in question present a physical "hard end" to further sea water encroachment. It would therefore be preferred to soften this effect as per No5 above.
7. Wainui Beach is one of New Zealand's most beautiful beaches. This asset needs to be maintained and protected. It is a famous national surf break. Gisborne is requiring enhanced new comers if only to contribute to further rate able income
8. There is a beach front protection fund which needs to be managed and made available to the public.
9. Commonsense and community spirit need to be the key requirements going forward.
